What's the point of watching films?

Cinema nurtures artistic sensitivity and contributes to children's intellectual, sensory, emotional and social development. Throughout school life, films create shared references and help children, from a very young age, learn to live together and grow into themselves. Children learn to form their own opinions about what they watch. That is the starting point of creativity.

Why short films?

Short formats are especially well suited to young viewers, as they help younger children sustain their attention and curiosity. Children should not passively endure what they watch, like mere consumers. Cinema should enrich the real world, not replace it: watching less, but also watching better.

Why free films?

Our education system places great emphasis on cultural democratization. Beyond social inequality, artistic education should give every student equal access to knowledge in the field of art. Free online tools extend the classroom beyond its walls and make it possible to watch again at home the films studied in class.

Why silent films?

Silent cinema gives children a voice. Try watching a silent film with your children. From the very first minute, the silent film turns into a film with as many dialogues as there are children: comments, interpretations, questions and laughter from the children.
